## April Fools

Before the meeting:

1. Purchase Bean Boozled Jelly Beans. Make sure you have enough jellybeans for everyone in your group to play at least once. Also give each student a cup or bowl to spit into just in case!
2. Plan out some fun snacks for this meeting! I used an empty coffee ground container (washed out well) and filled it with Oreo cookies that I put in the blender. They look just like coffee grounds! Then I filled an empty mayonnaise gallon jug with vanilla pudding. It was so fun to watch the students turn their noses up in disgust as I was serving their snacks.
3. Decide how you want the students to play the trivia game. You may need to collect additional supplies for the "buzzer" and for keeping score.
4. Print out the trivia game answers and have them handy. Just don't let the students see them ahead of time!

## What is April Fools?:

## What History.com says:

On this day in 1700, English pranksters begin popularizing the annual tradition of April Fools' Day by playing practical jokes on each other.

Although the day, also called All Fools' Day, has been celebrated for several centuries by different cultures, its exact origins remain a mystery. Some historians speculate that April Fools' Day dates back to 1582, when France switched from the Julian calendar to the Gregorian calendar, as called for by the Council of Trent in 1563. People who were slow to get the news or failed to recognize that the start of the new year had moved to January 1 and continued to celebrate it during the last week of March through April 1 became the butt of jokes and hoaxes. These included having paper fish placed on their backs and being referred to as "poisson d'avril" (April fish), said to symbolize a young, easily caught fish and a gullible person.

Historians have also linked April Fools' Day to ancient festivals such as Hilaria, which was celebrated in Rome at the end of March and involved people dressing up in disguises. There's also speculation that April Fools' Day was tied to the vernal equinox, or first day of spring in the Northern Hemisphere, when Mother Nature fooled people with changing, unpredictable weather.

April Fools' Day spread throughout Britain during the 18th century. In Scotland, the tradition became a two-day event, starting with "hunting the gowk," in which people were sent on phony errands (gowk is a word for cuckoo bird, a symbol for fool) and followed by Tailie Day, which involved pranks played on people's derrieres, such as pinning fake tails or "kick me" signs on them.
In modern times, people have gone to great lengths to create elaborate April Fools' Day hoaxes. Newspapers, radio and TV stations and Web sites have participated in the April 1 tradition of reporting outrageous fictional claims that have fooled their audiences.
