

Easter Games Youth Night

If you do not hold your youth night in a school, you will need to refigure your clues to work for your area. These clues worked for our Catholic K-8 School.

What you Will Need:

Plastic Easter Eggs 6 of each color. You will want enough colors for each group.

Easter Basket with goodies for each group

Bucket or Large Easter basket for each group

Plastic spoons

Game Prizes

Prep:

Permission from the school to conduct an egg hunt through the school

Print the clues and cut them apart. You will need to reconfigure the clues if they do not work for your area. Find a Bible verse that fits with the area you want them to look

Put one clue in each egg for each color

Before the students come, hide the eggs in the designated spots are the school (or youth center)

Here's where I hid the eggs in order of the clues:

On the stage in the gym

In the youth room couch

On chairs at a table in the cafeteria

On a table under the Bingo board

On the Lost and Found Table (or tote)

Their baskets were on the milk cooler in the cafeteria

Announcements: Let your youth group know of any upcoming events, youth nights, or other activities they should be aware of

Egg Hunt: Break into groups

Rules:

Each group gets a different color egg to start

Your group can only collect eggs in your color

Each egg contains a clue as to where to find the next egg

If you figure out a clue don't give it away to other groups

When your group has collected all 6 eggs and found the treasure at the end, come back to your seats

Please keep all 6 eggs intact for the next game. We will be using them again.

Eggs could be found (give perimeters of where they are allowed to look)

Egg Relay: Line the buckets up at one end of the play area. Each team will line up at the other end of the play area across from their bucket. The team members will take turns getting the eggs into the bucket using a spoon. If the egg drops, they will start back from the beginning. They cannot touch the egg while walking the egg to the bucket. The first team to get all of their eggs into the bucket wins!

Egg Throw: Have each team select 2 players. One player will hold the bucket on their head. The other player will stand 3-4 feet across from them and toss the eggs one at a time into the bucket that is on another team member's head. The person with the bucket cannot move their feet, but can move their body as long as the bucket stays on their head. The first team to get all of their eggs into the bucket wins! You can continue playing this until all team members have had a chance to play.
