St. Patrick's Day

Prep:

Print the scavenger quiz. You will need 1 for each group of 4-5 students. Laminate them (you can use packing tape or contact paper to cover the fronts of each page if you do not have a laminator).

Make a scratch-off paint by mixing two parts acrylic paint with 1 part liquid dish soap. In each box, paint a thin coat of the special paint to cover the entire box. Let it dry, then add a second and third. If you can still see the print, add another layer until you cannot see the printing. Remember, you don't want to be able to see through the paint. Don't worry if you paint outside the box as you can scratch it off later.

Print off enough of the St. Patrick story pages for each group of 4-5 students.

Hide a "pot of gold" under a rainbow somewhere in the room for each group. I made my own rainbow poster an hung it on door of the supply locker, then put the pots of gold inside the cabinet.

Print Bingo cards on cardstock. There are 2 to a sheet. Cut the sheets in half, so there are 30 cards total and 2 blank cards in case you need to make more. The last 3 pages are the numbers to use to call. Cut these apart and mix them up well

You Will Need:

One gold colored "pot" or cup, bowl, bucket, filled with gold chocolate coins per group of students.

A rainbow that you can hang somewhere in the room. I made my own, but if you have a poster or printout of a rainbow that works, too.

Prizes for the winners. Bingo may have several winners, so find something like a bag of candy.

Chips, plastic coins, or paper squares to cover the Bingo cards. You might want enough for each student to cover their boards.

St. Patrick's Day Agenda

Prayer: As I arise today, may the strength of God pilot me, the power of God uphold me,

the wisdom of God guide me. May the eye of God look before me, the ear of God hear me,

the word of God speak for me, May the hand of God protect me, the way of God lie before me,

St. Patrick's Day Treasure Hunt: Divide group into teams of 4-5 students. Give each team a copy of the story of St. Patrick and the scratch-off quiz. The student closest to age of 14 (the age of St. Patrick when he was captured by Irish Pirates) will be team captain. Team captain should read the story of St. Patrick. When finished, teams will take the quiz and scratch off the correct answer. If their answer was correct, they will have a clue under one of the scratch offs. The clue will lead each team to their pot of gold.

St. Patrick's Day Bingo: Play just like Bingo. Give each student a bingo card and markers to cover the squares. Shuffle the calling cards and draw one at a time until someone hits bingo. Hand out prizes for Bingos! This can be played until the students get bored or until youth group is over. I like doing this last because it is so flexible.

St. Patrick of Ireland is one of the world's most popular saints. He was born in Roman Britain and when he was fourteen or so, he was captured by Irish pirates during a raiding party and taken to Ireland as a slave to herd and tend sheep. At the time, Ireland was a land of Druids and pagans but Patrick turned to God and wrote his memoir, *The Confession*.

In *The Confession*, he wrote: "The love of God and his fear grew in me more and more, as did the faith, and my soul was rosed, so that, in a single day, I have said as many as a hundred prayers and in the night, nearly the same. I prayed in the woods and on the mountain, even before dawn. I felt no hurt from the snow or ice or rain."

Patrick's captivity lasted until he was twenty, when he escaped after having a dream from God in which he was told to leave Ireland by going to the coast. There he found some sailors who took him back to Britain and was reunited with his family.

A few years after returning home, Patrick saw a vision he described in his memoir: "I saw a man coming, as it were from Ireland. His name was Victoricus, and he carried many letters, and he gave me one of them. I read the heading: 'The Voice of the Irish.' As I began the letter, I imagined in that moment that I heard the voice of those very people who were near the wood of Foclut, which is beside the western sea-and they cried out, as with one voice: 'We appeal to you, holy servant boy, to come and walk among us.'"

The vision prompted his studies for the priesthood. He was ordained by St. Germanus, the Bishop of Auxerre, whom he had studied under for years, and was later ordained a bishop and sent to take the Gospel to Ireland.

Patrick arrived in Slane, Ireland on March 25, 433. There are several legends about what happened next, with the most prominent claiming he met the chieftain of one of the druid tribes, who tried to kill him. After an intervention from God, Patrick was able to convert the chieftain and preach the Gospel throughout Ireland. There, he converted many people - eventually thousands - and he began building churches across the country.

He often used shamrocks to explain the Holy Trinity and entire kingdoms were eventually converted to Christianity after hearing Patrick's message.

Patrick preached and converted all of Ireland for 40 years. He worked many miracles and wrote of his love for God in Confessions. After years of living in poverty, traveling and enduring much suffering he died March 17, 461.

He died at Saul, where he had built the first Irish church. He is believed to be buried in Down Cathedral, Downpatrick. His grave was marked in 1990 with a granite stone. In His Footsteps:

Patrick was a humble, pious, gentle man, whose love and total devotion to and trust in God should be a shining example to each of us. So complete was his trust in God, and of the importance of his mission, he feared nothing -not even death.
